Respond in your WNB (right page):

- After a long detour, Krakauer brings us back to the scene of McCandless' death. What does he discuss in these chapters that he did not in previous chapters? Why did he delay presenting this information?
- 2. Krakauer provides many quotations from McCandless' journal in these chapters. What is McCandless talking about? Why did Krakauer include these selections?
- Krakauer quotes one of McCandless' friends, who said that McCandless "was born in the wrong century" (174). Find this quote, and explain whether you believe it is true.

Write a 1-paragraph response detailing your reactions to the epilogue. You can write your own thoughts and feelings OR use the following questions to guide you:

- 1. What was your initial sense of McCandless' mental condition compared to what you think now?
- 2. What was your reaction to his parents as they visited the bus?
- 3. Comment on the last sentence of the epilogue. How might the disappearing visual of the bus parallel McCandless' journey?
