Fun with "Thoughtcrime" and "Doublethink"

<u>1984</u>

Background

Big Brother, the government of Oceania in <u>1984</u>, attempts to control ideas of the population by introducing an invented language - "Newspeak." This is a simplified version of "Oldspeak," which is what we commonly know as English.

The grammar and rules of Newspeak are described in an appendix at the end of the novel, but a few of the words are introduced early on:

Ingsoc = English Socialism; **Doublethink** = believing two contradictory ideas at once; **Thoughtcrime** = thoughts that question the government

Fun with "Thoughtcrime"
