Author Interview

Imagine you have a chance to sit down with any of the authors whose works we have read so far in this unit.

Select an author and develop a set of questions you would ask him or her (8-10 questions, or more if you have more).

CHALLENGE: Come up with responses that you think that author would have to your questions.

Read: "The Transformation of Silence into Language and Action"

- Annotate points of interest or places for clarification
- Revisit your predictions: Did any turn out to be true?
- What surprised you?
- If your prediction was inaccurate, what mislead you?
- What, if anything, do you find confusing?
- Write a single sentence that summarizes Lorde's argument.

Descriptive Outline

- 1. Draw a line where the introduction ends. Make a note explaining why you feel the introduction ends there.
- 2. Draw a line where the conclusion begins. Make another note explaining why you feel the conclusion begins there.
- 3. Divide the speech into sections by topic. Make a note explaining what each section SAYS (content/summary) and DOES (purpose/reasoning).
- 4. At the end, describe the overall content and purpose of the speech.

How does Lorde's speech differ from more traditional academic arguments?
