History of the Church of England

- Originally a conflict of authority between church and state
 - Magna Carta (1215) declares that "English church is separate from its government"
- Reformed in early 1500s by Henry VIII
 - Rumor that it was because the Pope would not grant his divorce
 - Spent most of his reign as King challenging Roman authority
- Church given some formal structure in 1562 by Queen Elizabeth I
 - Binding factors include shared beliefs (Holy Bible) and tradition (Book of Common Prayer)

Developing Separation

- Church of England retained many Roman Catholic values, which Puritans rejected
 - Puritans wished to "purify" the church of these Catholic values
- Queen Elizabeth I died in 1603; her successor was James I
 - Asserted his own "divine right" and supported English Catholics
 - Puritans felt repressed by this and desired to separate from the Church
 - Wished to build "City on a Hill" to show how truly righteous and godly people should live

Puritanism

Puritans: Protestant reformers who wanted to "purify" the Church of England

Why did they want to reform the Church?

- Emphasis on the righteousness of God
- God directed all things by His will
- Differed from existing Catholic point of view (priests were holier than the rest of the congregation)
- Partial to the teachings of the Old Testament
- Believed human beings were depraved sinners; SOME (not all) could earn salvation

Puritan Beliefs

- Religion was the most influential cultural force
- Values and beliefs directed all aspects of life
 - Thrift, hard work, responsibility, religion
- Human struggle with sin was a daily mission to overcome
 - The Bible was a tool to use for this; it helped overcome all weaknesses
- Believed in eternal punishment
 - Some could be spared by faithfully following values approved by God
- Tended to be inflexible in religious faith and intolerant of other views

"Of Plymouth Plantation"

- Written by William Bradford between 1630 and 1651
- Details the Puritans' journey from England to Massachusetts and their experiences in the New World
- Intended this to be a work to be read repeatedly for many years after its origination
